

SOCIAL SECURITY AGREEMENT WITH KOREA

The Government of India has entered into an Agreement on Social Security Agreement with The Republic of Korea. Following the principles of reciprocity this agreement is intended to benefit the employees of both India as well as The Republic of Korea. The Agreement has come into force w.e.f. 1st November, 2011.

The Agreement provides inter-alia for posting i.e. detachment up to a period of 60 months for employees of both the countries. Accordingly, the employees of one country deputed by their employers to the other country on short-term assignment for a pre-determined period of upto a 60 months need not remit Social Security contributions in that country. Thus, the employers are saved from making double social security contributions for the same set of employees thereby enhancing the competitiveness of their products and services.

Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) has been identified as the Competent Agency to implement the provisions of the agreement in India and has been authorized to issue "Certificate of Coverage" to the employees of Indian establishment posted to The Republic of Korea.

Therefore, the employers who have already deputed/intend to depute their employees to The Republic of Korea can avail of this facility.
